The current town supervisor has had eight years as the town's chief financial officer and twelve years as a councilman for a combined twenty years on the Town Board to get this right and to look out for the future fiscal well-being of our community. It's called PLANNING. Yet, what has he done year after year? Aside from going above the 2% tax cap every year, he prefers to be reactive rather than proactive with the Town's finances, such as filing for bonds instead of planning capital projects and setting the money aside and, thus, kicks the proverbial can down the road.

What about those lawsuits that we never hear about? And why did our town struggle to find an insurance company to insure itself this year? Too many lawsuits against the town?
